3. <u>BUSINESS MATTERS</u>

- 3.1 Discussion of FY20 Budget
- -Mr. Bullington informed the Board that the Governor has promised to raise the Base Support Level by \$185 per student in FY20, which is a 5% planned increase. Last year the increase was 10% and next year (FY)21) it will be 5% again.

- 3.2 Discussion and Consideration of 2019-2020 School Calendar
- -Clay Tyree made a motion to accept the School Calendar as proposed, April Drane seconded. Motion passed 3-0 (Tyree-aye, Dazzo-aye, Drane-aye)
- 3.3 Discussion and Consideration of FY20 Employee Salary Schedules
- -This was tabled until April's Board meeting.
- 3.4 Discussion of AZ Auditor General FY18 Spending Report
- -Owen's letter grade should be going up to a B this year. Some costs exceed our peer group but enrollment numbers are a big factor in this analysis. Owen's financial stress remains low.
- 3.5 Discussion of Transwestern Pipeline Legislation
- -The approximately \$28,000 that Owens needs to refund to the State of Arizona, (because Transwestern Pipeline appealed the 2016 and 2017 full cash values as determined by the ADOR and won their appeal), will most likely be refunded to the school. S.B. 1019 proposes to appropriate \$3,000,000 from the state general fund to reimburse affected school districts. Mr. Bullington will keep the Board updated.

- -The two HVAC units on the main building have finally been replaced. We are waiting on a final rebid for the roof projects; the K-5 building will be done first. Still working on getting the siding approved for the main building.

- -The Owen's students will be attending a Science Fair/Career Day at the Bagdad campus tomorrow.
